Remote Diving Destinations”**

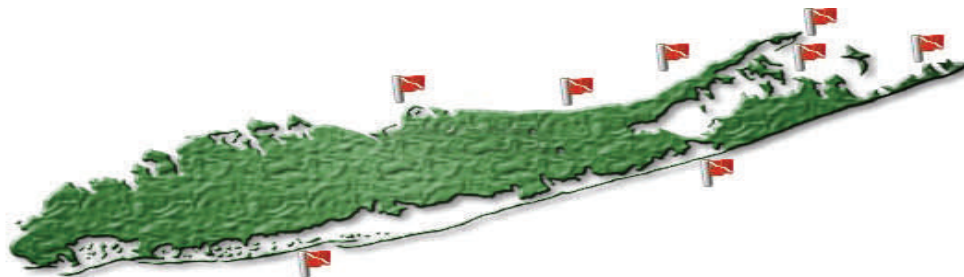

Directions: Wantagh Parkway to Hempstead Turnpike West or Meadowbrook Parkway to Hempstead Turnpike East. Nassau University Medical Center is halfway between the Wantagh and Meadowbrook Parkways, on the North side of Hempstead Turnpike. Go to the main entrance and ask for the Amphitheater.

Long Island stretches East about 120 miles and is surrounded by the Long Island Sound and the Atlantic Ocean. The region’s coast provides more than 1,180 miles of shoreline. This shoreline offers some of the most diverse and fascinating ecosystems on the East coast including marsh, tidal zones, glacial carved North shores, inlets and the mighty Atlantic. It offers an amazingly profound set of diving experiences for such a compact geographic area. Yet, most divers can probably count the number of accessible dive locations on one hand. And more often than not, it’s the maze of “no parking” signs, “no trespassing” signs and privatized shoreline that deter divers from straying off the beaten path.

“**Getting There**” is a discussion of imaginative solutions to finding and gaining access to some of Long Island’s seemingly remote dive locations.
